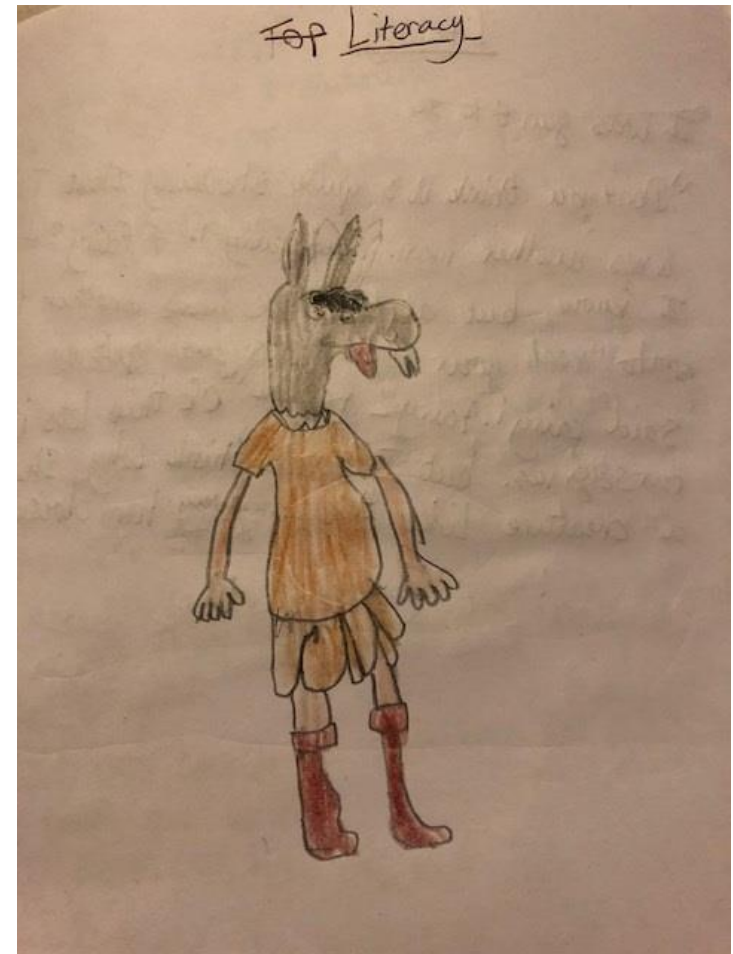
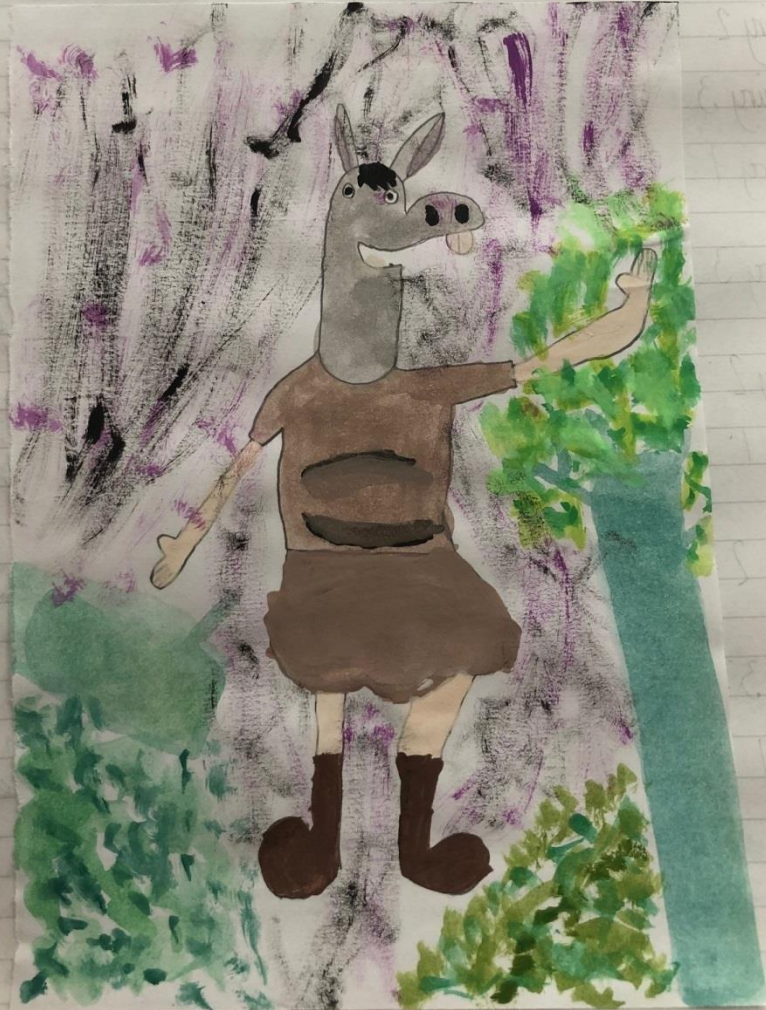


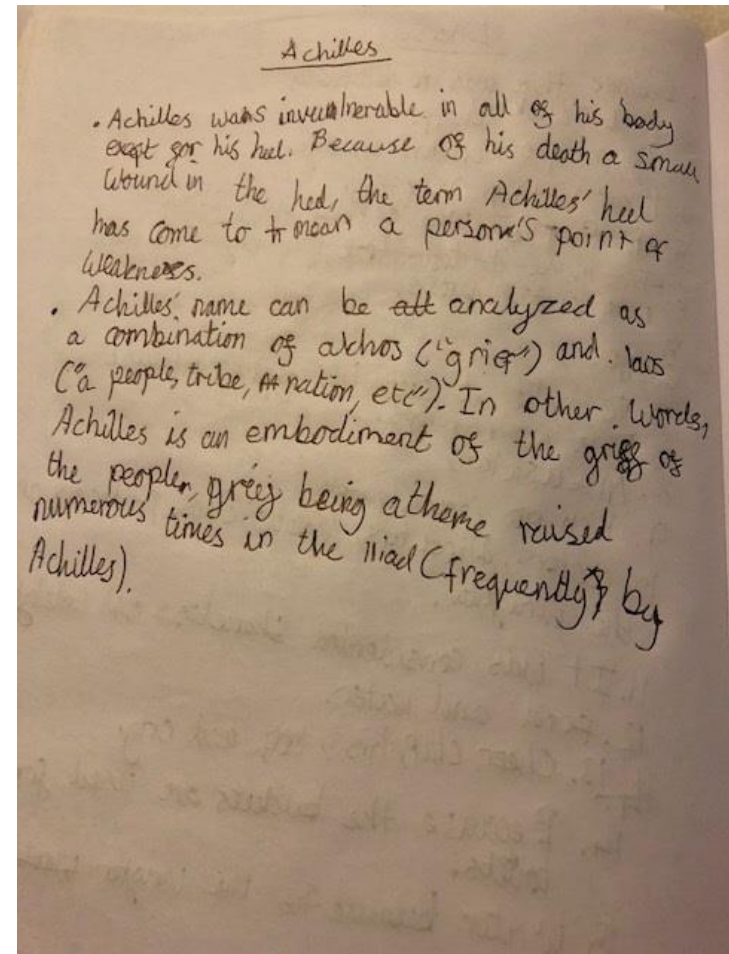
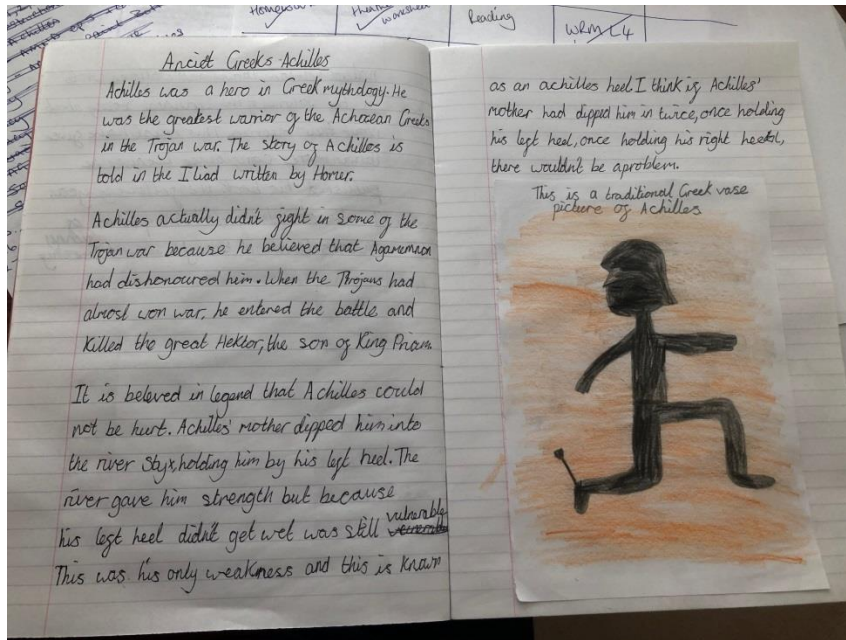
Bottom – with the head of a donkey – Johnny, Lucy and Sophie



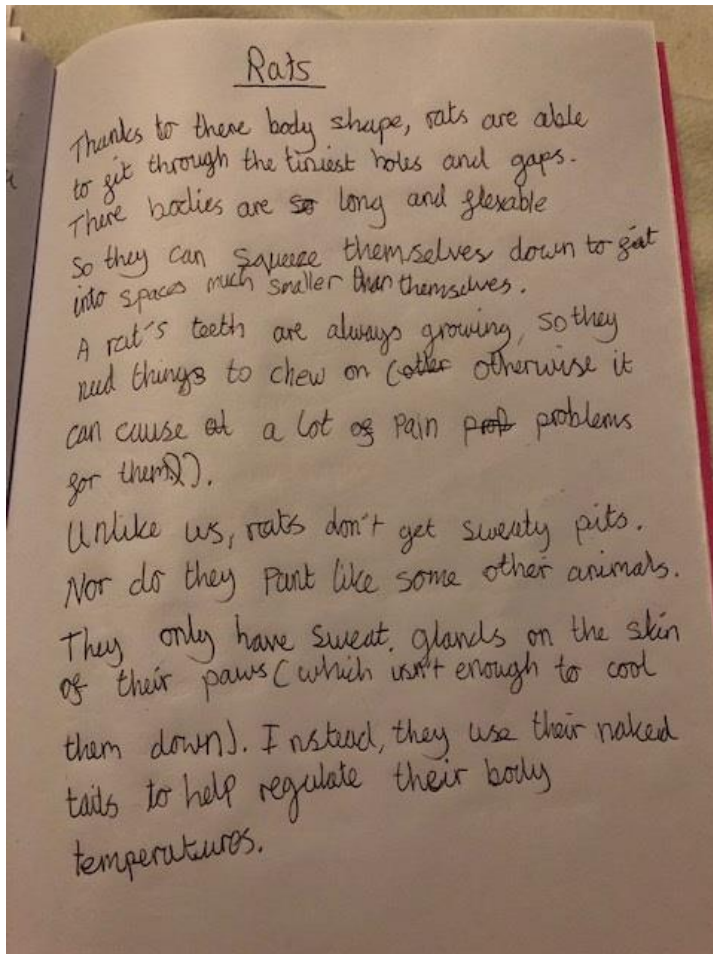
