In the college there is a green door for the white rabbit's door and just beyond a tree for the Cheshire cat.

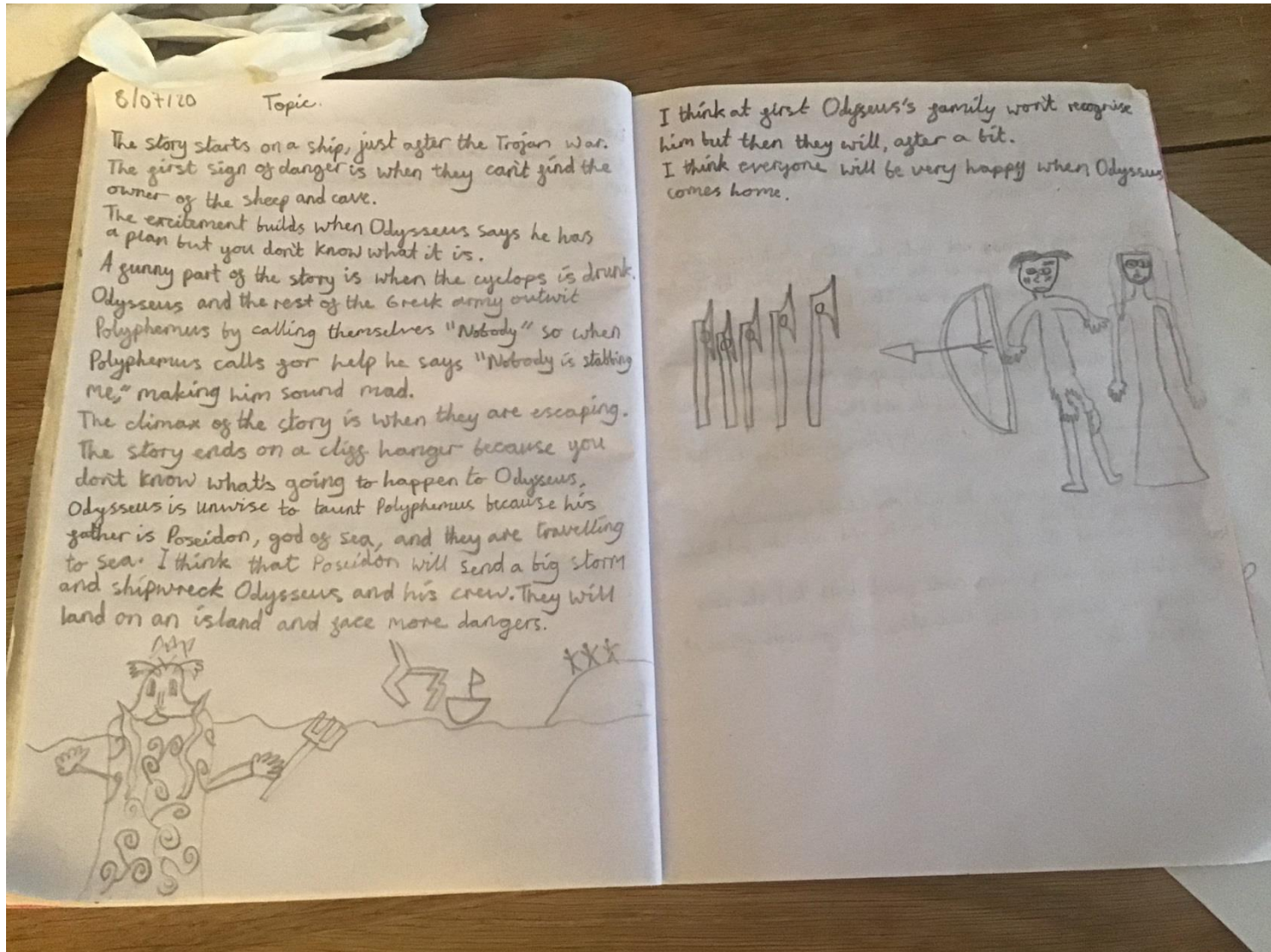
Carroll's actual name is Charles Lutwidge Dodgson.

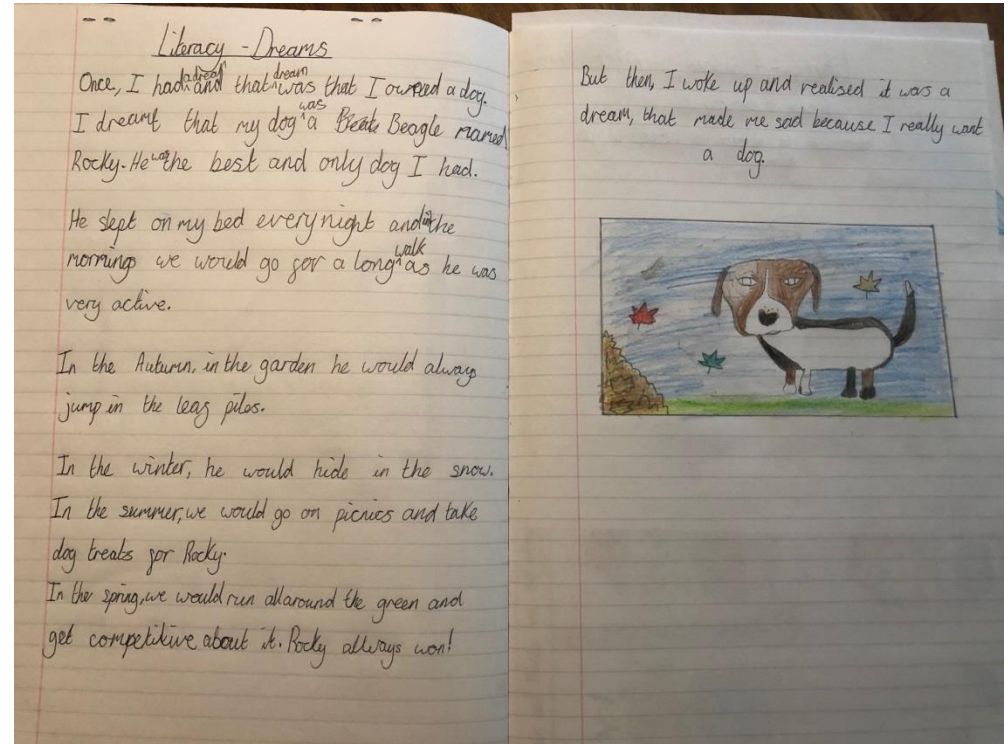
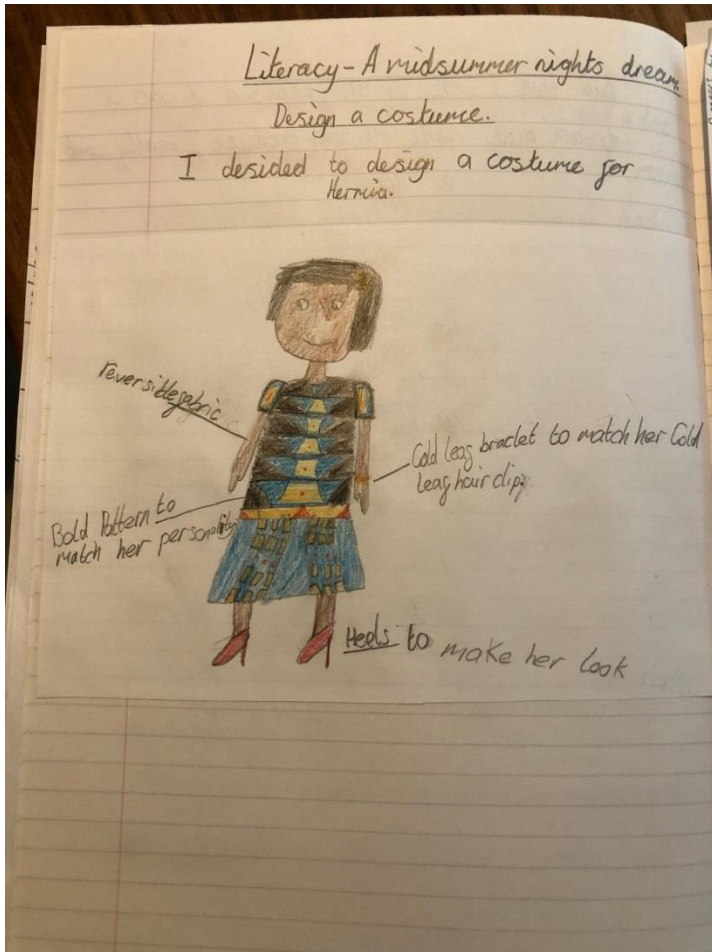
