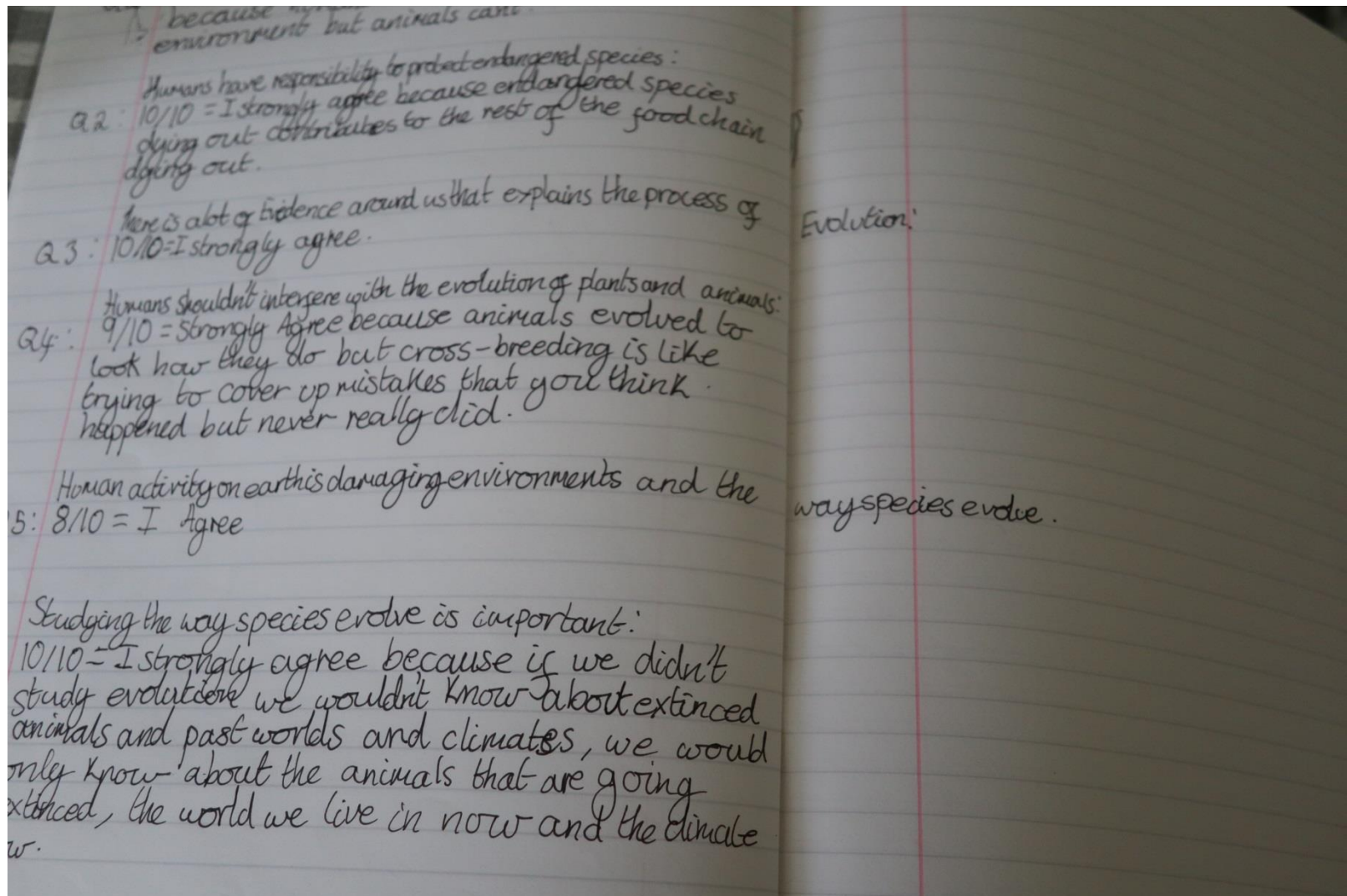

I agree with this, fossils are a great way of understanding how evolution works.

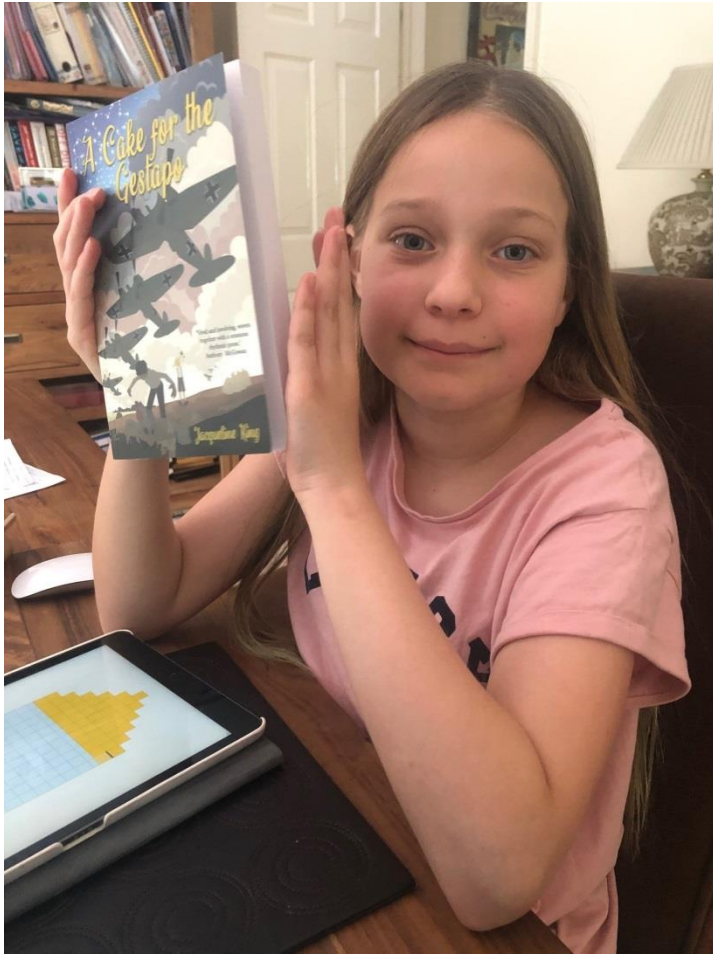
Humans should not interfere with the evolution of plants and animals through cross-pollination and selective breeding. 4
