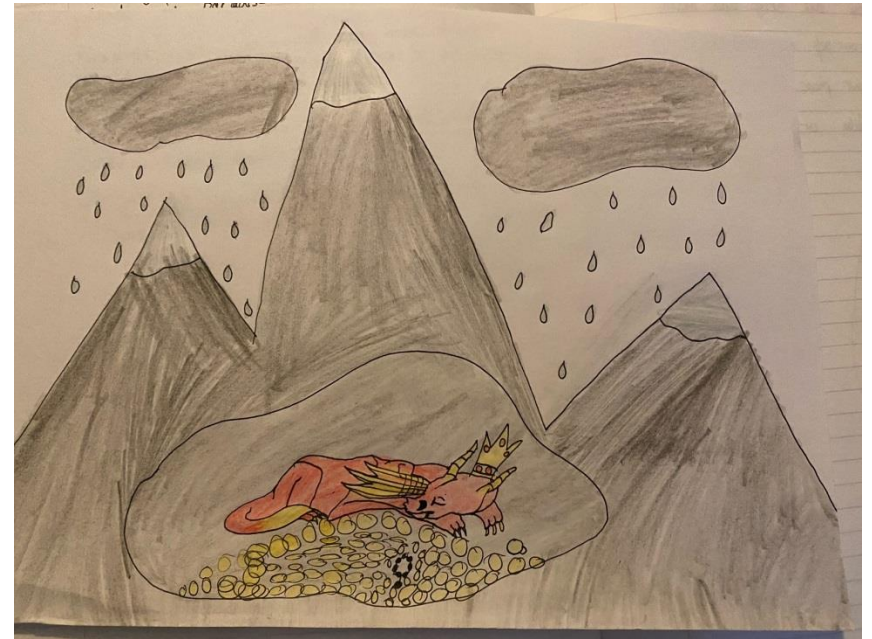

Rationing

Rationing began on 8th January 1940 when bacon, butter and sugar were rationed.

By 1942, many other foodstuffs, including meat, milk, cheese, eggs, and cooking fat, were also on the ration.

Bacon/ham	4 oz	
Other meats	4 oz	
Butter	2 oz	
Cheese	2 oz	
Margarine	4 oz	
Cooking fat	4 oz	
Milk	3 pints	
Sugar	8 oz	
Preserves	1 lb every 2 months	
Tea	2 oz	
Eggs	1 egg (plus allowance of dried egg)	
Sweets	12 oz every 4 weeks
