A mountain is a landform that rises high above its surroundings. Taller than a hill, it usually has steep slopes and rounded or sharp peak. Mountains are rarely found alone. Groups of mountains are called ranges. Most geologists classify a mountain as a landform that rises at least 1000 feet or more. The five types of mountains are a dome, a fault block, a fold, a plateau and a volcanic.
